COL Tina Schoenberger completed the U.S. Army War College, as an Office of the Director of National Intelligence Fellow with duty at the National Counterproliferation and Biosecurity Center. COL Schoenberger's most recent assignment was the Plans, Integration and Assessments Division Chief for U.S. Special Operations Command (USSOCOM) J10-Countering Weapons of Mass Destruction (CWMD) Directorate. This directorate executes the Coordinating Authority for CWMD for CDRUSSOCOM. She led CWMD planning support for the Office of the Secretary of Defense (OSD), Geographical (GCCs) and Functional Combatant Commands (FCCs) for campaign, contingency and crisis action planning to include the SECDEF's Functional Campaign Plan for CWMD. She led the execution of the annual CWMD Assessment for SECDEF readiness and capability recommendations (2020 - 2022).

In her previous assignment, COL Schoenberger served as a J5 Division Chief at the Joint Special Operations Command (JSOC). She was also a J5 Branch Chief, and the Defense Threat Reduction Agency (DTRA) liaison officer to JSOC (2014 – 2020).
